Why internationalise?

Internationalisation enhances the quality and openness of education.

- Collaborative innovation
- Student and teacher mobility opportunities
- Access to EU resources and funding



What is the Erasmus+ Project Results Platform?

The Erasmus+ Project Results Platform is the official online database of all Erasmus+ projects funded by the EU. It offers access to thousands of real examples, tools, and resources from completed and ongoing projects across Europe.

The platform allows teachers and school staff to:

- **Search for EU-funded projects** by topic, country, or sector (e.g., school education, VET)
- **Explore best practices and innovative tools** produced by other educators and institutions
- **Get inspired by successful initiatives** on inclusion, digital education, sustainability, civic engagement, and more
- **Find potential partners** for future Erasmus+ collaborations through project contact details
- **Identify trends and priorities** in education and training across Europe

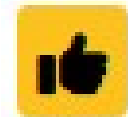

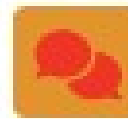

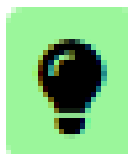

The “Fields” filter allows you to explore E+ projects by sector. For schools and teachers, the most relevant fields are:

SCH: School Education → This is the primary field for schools. It includes projects focused on teaching and learning in pre-primary, primary, and secondary education.

VET: Vocational Education and Training → Relevant if your school includes vocational tracks or collaborates with VET institutions. Useful for exploring work-based learning, digital tools, and partnerships with companies.

YOU: Youth → While this field is not directly designed for formal school education, teachers can still find valuable inspiration here, for example, ideas on student engagement, youth leadership, or how to complement classroom teaching with extracurricular initiatives

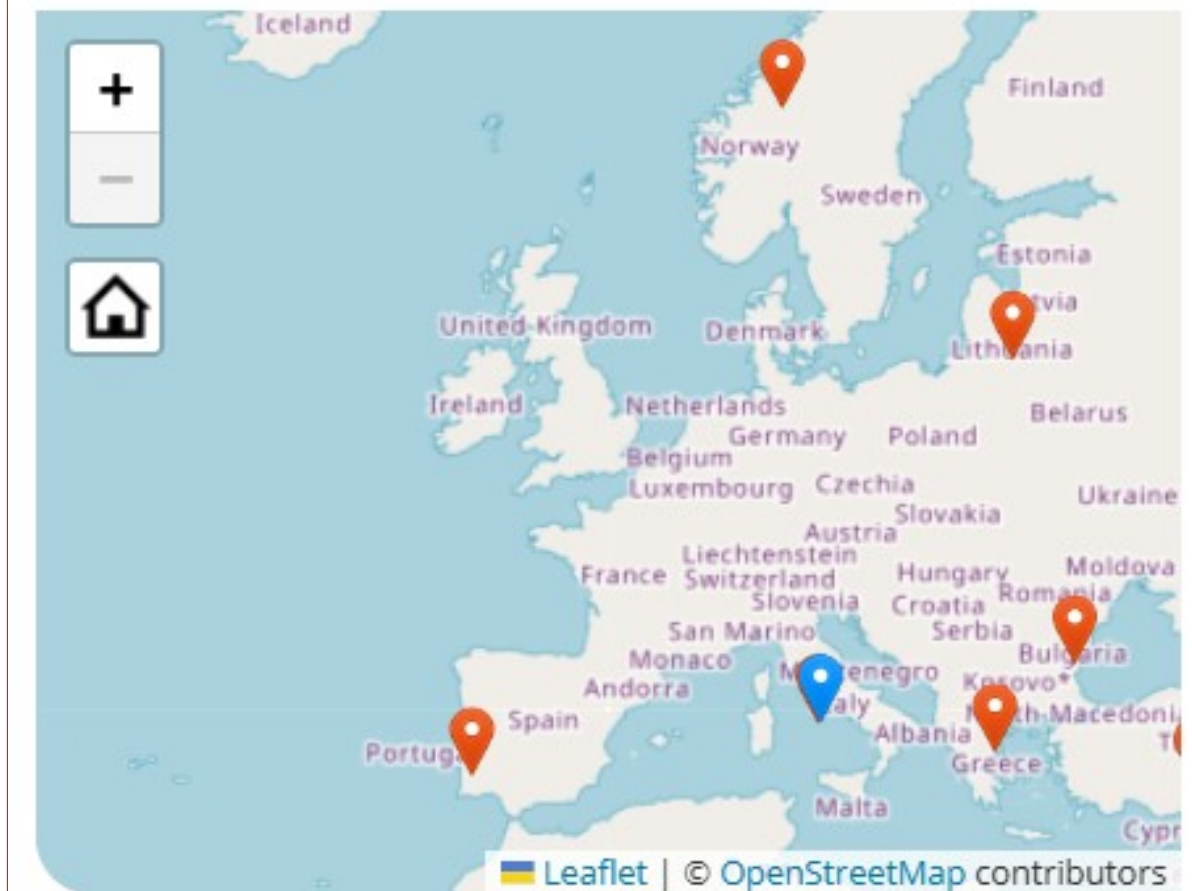

 PROJECT RESULT ID2: T.E.A.M.I Train the trainer Continuing Professional Development Programme

Description

Under the leadership of Universo CLIL (IT), this result included:

2.1 A blended T.E.A.M.I Train The Trainer Course, divided into three modules of 15 hours each. Module 1 was conducted online in May 2022, followed by Modules 2 and 3 during an LTTA in Lithuania in September. Following the training, SEL team coaches trainers organized a 12-hour training session for at least 20 additional teachers, equipping them with essential SEL skills.

2.2 A SEL Train the Trainer Team Coaching Guide, structured into three sections: Coaching, SEL, and Mindfulness. The guide also included learning tips for future trainers, addressing features, characteristics, and behaviors to consider before, during, and after training sessions.

Build your contact network

Guidelines

Use filters such as:

- Action type (Jean Monnet, KA1, KA2)
- Field (e.g., School Education, VET)
- Topics relevant to your interests (e.g., inclusion, digital learning, sustainability)
- Country or region if you have a target area in mind

Identify at least 3 Relevant Projects

- Choose projects that match your school's profile, challenges or future plans
- Focus on those labelled as "Good Practice" for inspiration

For each project, take note of:

- Title and summary
- Main objectives or practices
- Countries involved
- Type of organisations (e.g. schools, NGOs)

Use Excel or Google Sheets to compile your findings

- Project Title
- Action Type
- Country
- Coordinator Name
- Partner Organisations
- Contacts of each organisation (name, website, email)
- topics / Keywords
